

Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG)

- 1. How often does the CER collect and publish data on liquid petroleum gas inventories?**
The CER collects and aggregates this data monthly. The most recent data reflects inventory levels as they stand at the previous month-end. For example, data released in January shows the inventory levels at December month end.
- 2. What is included in this dataset?**
This dataset includes month-end underground inventory levels for propane, butane(s), and natural gas liquids (NGL) mix.
- 3. Are above-ground facilities included in this dataset?**
No, the dataset only includes underground facilities (that is, salt caverns). The dataset includes caverns in Alberta and Saskatchewan (Western Canada), and Ontario (Eastern Canada).
- 4. How does the CER collect this information?**
Underground facility operators holding an export order or license are required under subsection 5(g) of the National Energy Board Export and Import Reporting Regulations to provide the CER with end-of-month inventory levels by commodity (propane, butane(s), and NGL mix) for their underground storage facilities. If the operator does not have an export order or license the operator can report on a voluntary basis.
- 5. What day of the month can I expect the data to be available?**
The release date may vary month to month depending on when the CER receives data from filing companies. The CER will endeavor to make the data available no later than the end of the third week of every month.
